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How to read the ward summaries

The ward summaries use national and local data sources to present information on the 61 indicators of health and wellbeing which make up the three domains of the WARM tool: Self; Supports; Systems and Structures) and ten components within these domains: There are two parts to each ward summary: RAG rating; and ranking of the ward.

A) RAG rating of indicators and components

Satisfaction with GP surgery
Satisfaction with local hospital
Travel time to local GP

Each of the 61 indicators has been coloured red, amber or green to represent the overall RAG rating for that indicator. Indicators are RAG rated based on 95% Confidence Intervals (CI) or, where this information is not available they are ranked using top and bottom quartiles. Red indicators are those which are significantly worse than the East Sussex average or in the worst quartile, amber indicators are similar to the East Sussex average and green indicators are significantly better than the East Sussex average or in the best quartile. From these, community assets and deficits have been identified to build a picture of community resilience across each ward. ‘Red indicators’ are identified as deficits and ‘Green indicators’ as assets.

An overall RAG rating is also calculated for each component based on the number of red, amber and green indicators that constitute the component. ‘Red components’ are where the majority of indicators are identified as deficits and ‘Green components’ are where the majority of indicators are identified as assets.

B) Ranking of wards for each indicator

For every indicator, the ward is ranked out of the total number of wards in East Sussex, with 1 being the best ward for that indicator and 101 being the worst. The ranking is included to highlight where the ward sits in the context of all wards in the county. Where the ward is within the ten best in the county the number is green, and where it is within the ten worst in the county it is red. Multiple wards can have the same ranking for an indicator if they have similar scores. A green ranking number does not necessarily mean that the indicator RAG rating will also be green if fewer than ten wards were significantly better than the East Sussex average for that indicator.
